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Florida Juniors Shoot for the Gold



On January 12 - 13, 2008, Junior precision shooters from all over the state gathered at the American Police Shooting Hall of Fame in Titusville to compete in The 2008 Florida State USA Shooting Junior Olympic

Rifle Championships.

Ranging in ages from under 14 to 20 yrs, twelve juniors competed in smallbore and air rifle for the State Championship and a chance to qualify for an invitation to the 2008 National Junior Olympic Shooting Championships.

In the men's category, Patrick Stidham won the State Championship and the Gold Medal in smallbore with a score of 569 and also in air rifle with a score of 566. Jimmie Cooper won the Silver Medal in both smallbore and air rifle. Chad Archambault won the Bronze Medal in both smallbore and air rifle.

In the women's category, Krystle Harris won the State Championship and the Gold Medal in smallbore with a score of 565 and also in air rifle with a score of 382. Marissa Marshall won the Silver medal in both smallbore and air rifle. Brittany Jones was the Bronze Medal winner in both smallbore and air rifle.

The State Qualifiers were Jimmie Cooper, in men's smallbore, and Krystle Harris, in women's smallbore and air rifle. They will receive the Florida invitations to compete in the USA Shooting 2008 National Junior Olympic Shooting Championships, which are held at the Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs, Co.

Florida Juniors Compete at the Eastern Region JROTC Championship

The 2008 Army, Air Force, Marine Corps and Navy JROTC Eastern Region Championships took place on U. S. Army Marksmanship Unit facilities at Fort Benning on 15-16 February.

Florida Juniors, Jimmie Cooper and Krystle Harris, were among the shooters who qualified to participate. All competitors had to qualify according to the scores they fired in the JROTC postals that were conducted in November and December. Only the top ten percent or so of the 5,974 cadets who fired in this school year's postal

matches qualified to advance to the Region Championships.

Jimmie Cooper, Sarasota Military Academy, FL, set two Army JROTC National Records enroute to winning the Army Precision Individual Championship. He also earned an invitation to the National JROTC Championships, which will take place March 27 ? 29 at Ft. Benning.

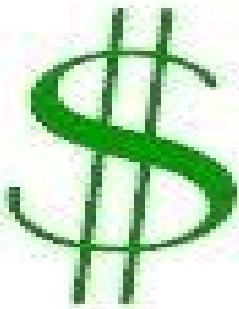

High Court Denies Request For Extra Time In Gun Case

WASHINGTON - In a brief order on Monday's order list the U.S. Supreme Court dashed the hopes of gun rights advocates who hoped to have two lawyers and additional time arguing their cause before the Supreme Court when it hears arguments in the historic case *D.C. v. Heller* on March 18.

Without explanation, the court denied the motion of Texas Solicitor General R. Ted Cruz for argument time on the side of Alan Gura of Gura & Possessky, who has argued the pro-Second Amendment position from the start of the case.

But the court did agree to give Solicitor General Paul Clement 15 minutes to argue, in addition to the 30 minutes for each side in the case.

The court's action can be read as a small but not insignificant victory for supporters of D.C.'s handgun control ordinance at issue in the case.

Cruz had argued to the court that he should be heard on behalf of 31 states favoring a broad view of the Second Amendment, because Solicitor General Paul Clement's brief in the case is "contrary" to the position of gun rights supporters. While Clement supports an "individual right" view of the Second Amendment, he advocates a standard of review that critics say will allow too many gun regulations to stand. Clement also urged vacating and remanding the lower court ruling of the D.C. Circuit U.S. Court of Appeals in the case, the first ever to strike down a gun regulation on Second Amendment grounds. Walter Dellinger of O'Melveny & Myers, who will argue in defense of the D.C. handgun ban, had opposed the Texas

motion, but supported Clement's request for added argument time.

It is very common for the court to say yes to a request from the solicitor general for argument time as *amicus curiae* no matter where he stands. As for states, in recent years they have won argument time with greater frequency – four times last term alone -- though this term the success rate has been lower. One factor working against Texas in the D.C. case is that states are not unanimous on the Second Amendment issue; New York, joined by Hawaii, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Jersey and Puerto Rico, filed a brief on the gun control side.

So, even though Clement's brief lends support to both sides, the net effect of Monday's court action is that the justices will hear 45 minutes of advocacy from those who want the lower court ruling eliminated, and 30 minutes from those who want it upheld.

Location: Gateway Rifle and Pistol Club, 9301 Zambito Road, Jacksonville, FL 32210

Eligibility: Open to any member of the National Rifle Association.

Teams will consist of four (4) firing members, one alternate, a captain and/or coach, and will represent either a club affiliated with the NRA (Rule 2.11 A or B), a regular service or reserve unit, including the National Guard (Rule 2.13), or a law enforcement agency (Rule 2.14). State Association Teams (Rule 2.12) may enter the team matches (Rule 2.12). The team captain and/or coach may be firing members of the team. Pick up teams are not allowed (Rule 2.10).

NRA Membership Number: In order to enter scores of competitors in the computer classification system, the competitors NRA membership number must be used. Juniors who are individual members of the NRA must put their Membership ID number on their entry card. Juniors who are not individual NRA members but members of an affiliated club must indicate this on their entry card.

Rules: Current NRA Conventional Pistol Rules will govern for the Regional Championship and NRA Distinguished Revolver Match. Current Civilian Marksmanship Program rules will govern for the CMP Service Pistol (Leg) Match. CMP affidavits will be processed during check in.

Souvenir Award: A souvenir award will be issued to each competitor.

Classification: The NRA classification system will be used in all matches. Individuals who have not been classified will fire in the Master Class. Rule 19.6 (Assigned Classification) may be used.

Categories: There will be Civilian and Military categories for this Regional Championship. NOTE: Police competitors will compete in Civilian category for awards only. Scores will be reported as Police category.

Classes: A minimum of 4 competitors (or 4 teams) will constitute a class. If less than 4 competitors (or 4 teams), those competitors will compete in the next higher class. If there are less than 4 High Masters in a category/class, they will compete for open awards only.

Challenges: A challenge fee of \$2 will be charged for each challenge made. See NRA rule 16 for correct procedure.

Squadding: All matches will be squadded. Squadding tickets for individual matches will be issued from the Statistical Office and will be available on Thursday, April 17 from 1:00 to 6:00. Competitors must pick up squadding tickets and competitors packets prior to shooting. NRA membership cards and classification cards must be exhibited before issue of squadding tickets. A competitor who fails to obtain his squadding tickets or who fails to present himself at the proper firing point when his relay is called may lose his right to compete in that event. Squadding information for the team matches will be posted at the Stat office by noon Friday, April 18.

Time of Firing: Firing will commence at 8:00 AM each day.

Entries:

Individual: Entries in individual events will be made by using the enclosed Statistical Office Record Form accompanied by check or money order. Checks should be made payable to **Gateway Rifle and Pistol Club**. Be sure to indicate your correct NRA classification, category and NRA membership ID number. Entries Close: Individual match entries must be received no later than April 1, 2008. Team match entries close at 11:00 AM of the day the team matches are to be fired.

Entries Limited: Entries are limited to 90 competitors. Preference will be given to competitors who fire the full schedule.

Post Entries: Post entries will be accepted up to the stated limit of the range, provided such entries will not require special relays.

Awards: NRA Regional Medallions for first, second, and third place open awards in the Regional Championship and first place awards in the Team Matches are provided by the NRA. Medals for the CMP Service Pistol Match are provided by the Civilian Marksmanship Program. All other awards are provided by Gateway Rifle and Pistol Club with 50% minimum of Regional fees being awarded back to competitors. Winner of Regional Championship will receive \$250 cash. NRA award points will be given for open and class winners in Matches 1-18 and class winners in Match 19. Second and third place class awards will be given for 8 and 12 competitors in class respectively.

Special Awards: Trophies will be awarded to the High Senior, High Woman, and High Junior.
